Parking across the ward

We've received several comments about parking across the Newington Ward. Reviews are taking place to consider reducing the amount of double yellow lines and increase parking if appropriate. We are having many complaints that residents are not parking in a neighbourly fashion and are restricting the parking opportunities available on the street. Please park with consideration for your neighbours by not blocking driveways, garages and so on and leave room for motorists to manoeuvre.

Don't forget it is an offence to park or drive a motor vehicle on footpaths.

Improving the environmental in your area

Stirling Street - after an unavoidable delay, works to improve property frontages and provide external insulation on Stirling Street will begin shortly following the securing of a new contractor.

Walton Street - projects to secure the Walton Street car park when not in use and to improve the site were due to start as this newsletter was being produced. It is hoped that these measures will prevent the anti-social behaviour from vehicles on the site and the illegal dumping of rubbish.

Guard rails have been placed on Walton Street at the exit/entrance to the park near the skate plaza.

Speed surveys are about to take place across the ward following several comments raised by residents in relation to public safety.

Children's play park finds new home



The children's play equipment, which had to be removed on Newington Street to make way for the regeneration works, now has a new home in Woburn Street. New swings and a new all-inclusive roundabout have been added to complement the existing equipment and provide much needed play space for all children in the area.
