THE KINGSTON UPON HULL SMOKE CONTROL ORDER 2019

Kingston upon Hull City Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under section 18 of, and Part III of Schedule 5 to, the Clean Air Act 1993 ("the Act"), hereby make the following Order:

1. The Order is entitled the Kingston upon Hull City Council Smoke Control Order 2019 ("the Order"). The Order will commence on the 1st of June 2020. All the existing Smoke Control Areas listed in Schedule 1 are hereby revoked from the same time that this Order comes into operation.

2. The Council declares that the whole of the area within its boundary to be a Smoke Control Area. The Order has been prepared and sealed with the common seal of the Council and has been deposited at the offices of the Council at The Guildhall, Alfred Gelder Street, Hull, HU1 2AA

3. In the whole of the Smoke Control Area created by this Order (that is, all land within the borough boundary), the operation of Section 20 of the Clean Air Act 1993 as amended by section 15 of the Deregulation Act 2015 (the prohibition on emissions of smoke) shall be applicable to all buildings.

4. Other than exemptions made by the Secretary of State under Section 21 of the Act as amended by section 15 of the Deregulation Act 2015, buildings or classes of buildings or fireplaces or classes of fireplaces in the Smoke Control Area that are exempt from the operation of Section 20 of the Clean Air Act 1993 as amended by section 15 of the Deregulation Act 2015 (the prohibition on emissions of smoke) by virtue of written approval from Hull City Council, are detailed in Schedule 2 of this Order.

5. Any buildings or classes of buildings or fireplaces or classes of fireplaces that by virtue of the Authority being satisfied they can be operated in an acceptable manner and that are granted Local Authority exemption, shall be detailed in Schedule 2 of this Order.

Justification	The installation had an exemption under SCO 21 (1989) and there have been no known issues. The installation was inspected on the 19 th of June 2018 by DW and PK, and no matters of concern were noted. The dwell time of the combustion products in the curing oven, determines the colour and taste of the fish, and consistency is a key customer requirement and therefore the process is tightly controlled. Due to the nature of the process, no exempt appliance exists.

Justification	The process has been in operation for around 30 years and there have been no known issues. The installation was inspected on the 25 th of July 2019 by DW, and no matters of concern were noted. The dwell time of the combustion products in the curing oven, determines the colour and taste of the fish, and consistency is a key customer requirement and therefore the process is tightly controlled. Due to the nature of the process, no exempt appliance exists.

Description	The appliance is housed in a plant room toward the rear of the site and serviced by a 400mm diameter flue which protrudes some 3m above the roof. Clean, virgin wood is chipped and automatically fed to the combustion chamber via purpose made

Justification	The process was inspected by AG and DW on 25/7/2019. Ordinarily, such a process would be subject to control via an Environmental Permit, and as such, the manufacturer has not applied for the MWE600 to be designated as an exempt appliance under the Clean Air Act 1993. However, due to the nature of the fuel, this installation does not meet the criteria for requiring a Permit. This was confirmed in discussions with the Local Authority Unit (LAU) of the Environment Agency (EA). The appliance has been tested, and certified to demonstrate that it meets the requirements of the Renewable Heat Initiative (RHI). Discussions with the manufacturer and subsequent certification demonstrate that this installation would meet the emission limits set in the appropriate Process Guidance Note.
