King George V Playing Fields - Junior Park Run - Sunday 28 April 9am park run, 9:30am litter pick

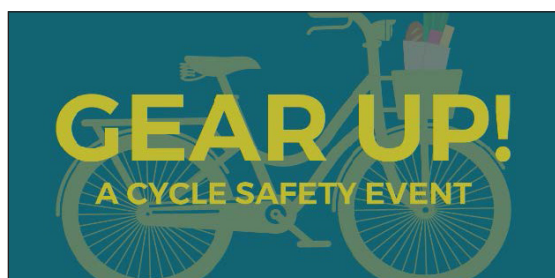
University of Hull, Student Hub - Wednesday 1 May 1pm

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Community defibrillator news

Cardiac arrests can happen to anyone at any time and action taken in the first few minutes afterwards can make a huge difference to someone's chances of survival. Research shows that the chance of survival following the onset of a cardiac arrest decreases by 7-10% for every minute of delay in commencing treatment.

A defibrillator is a device that is placed externally on the body to deliver an electric shock to restart the heart of someone who is in cardiac arrest. The device will only discharge an electric shock if the heart has stopped. This high energy shock is called defibrillation, and it's an essential part in trying to save the life of someone who's in cardiac arrest.

Modern defibrillators are simple and safe to operate and use. Once attached, the defibrillator will automatically analyse the individual's heart rhythm and, if required, apply a shock to restart it or advise that CPR should be continued. You cannot harm an individual by using a defibrillator; the machine will not issue an electric shock if a heartbeat is detected. All AED units will provide clear step by step instructions on what you need to do to help save the life of someone in cardiac arrest.

The HANDS Partnership seeks the support of the local business community to plug the gaps, giving your business and local communities access to this vitally important first-aid equipment.

The Partnership consists of Hull City Council, Yorkshire Ambulance Service, Help for Health, Humberside Fire & Rescue Solutions, The Oliver King Foundation and Connexin.

Working with our students

Further to various partners attending Welcome Week for this year's new students, we continue with regular weekly drop-in sessions to give students an opportunity to talk to the council, police, support services and waste management about their ideas and concerns.

Student Safety Group

A group of professionals have formed as a 'Student Social Safety Group. They meet monthly to address the concerns of students around their safety outside of academic times both on campus and within Hull. This is chaired by Rachel Brocklesby, Hull City Council's Violence Prevention Officer. The group is made up of council staff (SaferHull, Neighbourhood Coordinators, Refresh), Hull University, Hull University Student Union, Humberside Police (NPT & Licensing), Renew, and Blue Door. The group is also linked to a Student Forum which ensures the voice of the students is current. Raji as President of Union Development chairs the Forum and he is supported by Lilly, President of Inclusion and Diversity. Students are encouraged to contact Raji or Lilly to get involved in the student forum.
