

Improvements to council properties

Traditionally built, brick, council homes have had their cavity walls filled and lofts insulated to improve their thermal efficiency. For council homes of non-traditional construction improvement and cladding works are taking place on the following streets in the area:

EASTMOUNT AVENUE JERVIS ROAD STANNINGTON DRIVE TAMAR GROVE THANET ROAD WANSBECK ROAD

Residents who will benefit from these works should have received a letter and information in September.

Fortem, the council contractor will be carrying out numerous surveys, erecting scaffolding, installing external wall insulation, roofing works and installing new windows and doors.

This is a whole house approach designed to give a 25 to 30-year life span to the outside of the property.

Work will take place between 8am - 5pm during the week with work on a Saturday taking place only if required and agreed by residents.

Works are expected to complete in autumn 2024 and take 10 - 14 weeks per property.

Whilst every measure will be taken to minimise inconvenience, due to the nature of the works there will be some level of noise and disruption to the neighbouring properties during working

hours.



We are reaching the final year of the improvement programme for around 800 Council properties, which has been made possible through government funding for social housing. Unfortunately the funding for privately owned homes remains much lower than in the past therefore we are unable to include them in the work. However if their home is suitable for the works then you can obtain a quote to pay for the work themselves.
