## Police and Crime Commissioner Elections - Thursday 2 May 2024



Please note that electors must show photo ID at their polling stations before they receive their ballot papers to vote for in May's elections for the Police Commissioner. If you don't have any of the accepted forms of ID you can apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate at:

Apply for photo ID to vote. (Called a 'Voter Authority Certificate') - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

Alternatively, you can vote by postal vote. You can have a postal vote simply because it would be more convenient for you or if you can't get down to the polling station, for example your work schedule means you can't get to a polling station. You will be sent a postal vote ballot pack before the election. Find out more about how to vote by post here -

Our agreed priorities were identified through data from the council's People's Panel and also by talking with local residents in the community.

- Priority 1 To improve safety and wellbeing and reduce crime and anti-social behaviour.
- Priority 2 To maintain and improve the environment including parks and open and spaces.

#### **Central Ward Park review**

Your councillors are aware of the importance of the ward's parks and open spaces. They have been working with the Neighbourhood team and Parks and Gardens service to look at the existing green spaces across the ward. We identified Vane Street, Collingwood Park, Peel Street Park, Liddell Street Park and Abbey Way Park as needing renovations and improvements. Money from the ward budget will be spent on ensuring these parks are safe and welcoming for the residents in the community. Middleton street park is currently in its procurement stage, and we hope to have this completed by Spring/Summer 2024.

# Traffic Regulation Orders / speed surveys / parking

Caroline Street junction had been brought to our attention as a major hazard. Ward councillors raised this with Highways and now new road markings are in place. Young people and older people complained about cars speeding outside Rise Academy. New SLOW road markings have recently been installed to ask drivers to be more careful and slow down. This was approved through the capital ward budget by ward councillors.

Councillors are aware of parking issues on Albany Street off Spring bank. The previous design of the parking bays was installed to improve the aesthetic of the street however due to road markings that have now faded this is causing issues with accessibility. Ward councillors have agreed ward budget funding towards an initial assessment of the area to look into these issues and explore potential solutions.
