Foredyke Green

There has been a real buzz recently regarding Foredyke Green, the open space located off Kesteven Way, opposite Kingswood Academy. It has a wooded area, pond and meadow where a number of different wildlife species have been identified in the area, including being home to bats. Green spaces like Foredyke Green are not only good for people's health and well being, they are vital for the environment too. They serve as natural filters by effectively absorbing carbon dioxide from the atmosphere. They also play a crucial role in biodiversity conservation by providing habitat for plants and animals. Discussions are in place to look at improving Foredyke Green and encouraging more habitats and responsible use of the area.

We also carried out a 'Community Clean up' in November which was a huge success. Several bags of rubbish were collected along with two shopping trollies that had been fly tipped in the pond. The event helped to garner interest to set up a 'Friends of Foredyke Green' group. In the Summer of 2022 one of my boys, Edward, decided to pick 35 bags of litter during his summer holidays and raised £175 for the WWF."

Love Your Neighbourhood

Love Your Neighbourhood recently attended the Kingswood Ward to carry out works to improve environmental standards. The streets included were Blackhall Close, Blackwater Way, Bowmont Way and Charnwood Close. All works were completed in two weeks, including additional work recommended by residents. Work included, leaf removal, fly-tip removals, verge edging, dog fouling clean up, shrub maintenance, litter picking and graffiti removal, resulting in a total weight of 16.25 tonnes removed.

Kingswood Community Centre

Kingswood Community Centre is based in Ashcombe Road, Kingswood Retail Park and is available to hire for meetings & events, the large hall has a capacity of 100. There is also a small meeting room available which has a capacity of 20.

There is a kitchen in the small meeting room that has a boiler to make hot drinks and a sink to wash up, but please note there are NO cooking facilities in this building.



There is a hot vending machine that offers coffee, tea and hot chocolate at £1.50 per drink.

Youth Hub

The Youth Hub is run by New Life Support.

The aim of New Life Support is to improve the lives of young people and their families across East Yorkshire. It offers open access youth hubs for young people aged 11-16.

The Kingswood Youth Hub operates a drop-in centre for two sessions a week, on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 6.30 – 8.00pm. It has a pool table, a table tennis table, games consoles, a computer, board games and offers other activities such as art resources and competitions such as karaoke.

The Kingswood Youth Hub:

- provides 1:1 support for those young people attending
- gives young people a place to go and things to do
- helps young people to gain new experiences and skills to improve their self-esteem
- facilitates workshops, such as DJ skills and video production has staff which encourages small, special interest groups through which young people can share and talk about their experiences
- empowers young people through offering information and advice
- facilitates holistic wellbeing and support through trained staff and volunteers
- provides free activities for young people in the area.

Revive Church

There is also a church service at the community centre led by the Revive Church which meets every Sunday morning from 10.30am for worship, prayer and bible teaching. There is also a programme for children aged 4-11. The Revive Church sees itself as a family where everyone is welcome, and it believes passionately that the good news of Jesus is still a message of hope and healing in a sometimes confusing world.
