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Grass verge and pavement parking

Residents complain about people parking on pavements and on grass verges. It doesn't make the area look good, and we are asking for your help.

Please ensure you only park vehicles on the road and not on the pavement, grass verge or public land. When this happens, it can cause a nuisance to residents, pose a danger to pedestrians and damages verges and pavements.

If verges and highways (including pavements) are damaged this has to be fixed and costs money which could otherwise be spent on other services for residents.

Bus Diversion Route in the event of Shannon Road being closed in an emergency

The council's Head of Transport & Traffic Management has worked with bus operators to identify a suitable bus diversion route which could be used in the event of an extended road closure on Shannon Road.

Following trials, the only suitable route for a diversion would be to use Douglas Road. Of course, this would be dependent on the location of the closure in place and if this route was still accessible.

This route would only be used if the bus can fit down Douglas Road, and residents who park on Douglas Road would be asked to move their vehicles so that the bus could use the road when any temporary closure is in place.

Police and Crime Commissioner and Local Government Elections - Thursday 2 May 2024

Please note that electors must show photo ID at their polling stations before they receive their ballot papers to vote for in May's elections for the Police Commissioner and local councillors. In the local council ballot, one councillor will be up for election. If you don't have any of the accepted forms of ID you can apply for a free Voter Authority Certificate at: Apply for photo ID to vote (called a 'Voter Authority Certificate') - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

Alternatively, you can vote by postal vote. You can have a postal vote simply because it would be more convenient for you or if you can't get down to the polling station, for example you are on holiday or because your work schedule means you can't get to a polling station. Anti-Social Behaviour - motorbikes and quadbikes

We are carrying out targeted patrols in the East Hull area to tackle the problem of motorbikes and quads being used in an anti-social way.

We are committed to making improvements but need your local knowledge and help identify where these motorbikes and quadbikes are being stored.

These bikes not only generate a large amount of anti-social behaviour related calls but many of them are stolen, non-road legal and the riders have no regards for public safety - riding dangerously and using them to commit other crimes.

We appeal to anyone who sees these bikes to report them to us so we can tackle this issue.

Even though we may not be able to do anything immediately, we will use all the information provided to build up a bigger picture so we can act action robustly.
