Ward Priorities

Current priorities identified for the area

1. Identify and investigate potential for off-road parking schemes
2. To improve community safety (including nuisance motor bikes)
3. To improve cleanliness of local environment including open and green spaces

Your local Ward Councillors and Neighbourhood Co-ordinator are currently working towards addressing these priorities. To find out more, pop into a surgery, forum, Think Tank or Drop-in.

Ward Budget Allocation 2024/25: Each ward is allocated a capital and revenue sum to support projects that benefit local communities. This fund targets initiative and projects that address the ward priorities.

If you are part of a Community Group and would like to apply for funding, ward budget criteria and application forms are available to download from the Neighbourhood Team's webpage - www.hull.gov.uk/neighbourhoodteam. Applications that respond to ward priorities are particularly welcome.

Charles Brady Court Update

Hull City Council is transforming the former Charles Brady Court sheltered housing scheme into a high quality supported accommodation for people with learning disabilities. The refurbished site will offer 36 self-contained flats, including dedicated respite apartments, helping people live more independently with the right support. This project will bring a long-empty building back into use and will provide a great housing option for people with learning disabilities. The work should be completed in 2026.

Humberside Police - Nuisance Motorcycles

Illegal Motorcycle activity is a source of reoccurring complaint from local communities, neighbourhoods and individual residents. The criminal and anti-social use of motorcycles can negatively impact the sense of local community safety, impact quality of life, while also, in some cases, pose a danger to riders and also the wider community.

Operation Yellowfin is a diverse problem-solving initiative across Humberside Police targeting the criminal and antisocial use of motorcycles across our communities in conjunction with partner agencies.



The use of illegal or off-road motorbikes can be reported to Humberside Police using 101, online through our online reporting tool or anonymously through Crimestoppers 0800 555 111.
