New Pedestrian Crossing on School Lane

We're pleased to share that a long-awaited pedestrian crossing is coming to Richmond Lane (near School Lane), bringing enhanced safety for everyone—especially pupils of Kingswood Parks Primary School and families accessing local amenities across Richmond Lane.



Over the summer holidays, Hull City Council's Highway Manager, met with some local children who were taking part in the Lifestyle 2025 project to discuss the plans. Together, they reviewed the proposed design and rollout strategy, offering valuable feedback to ensure the crossing meets the needs of the community.

This development marks a significant step forward in making Kingswood safer and more accessible for all. Stay tuned for updates in the new year as the project progresses

Dog fouling is a crime

There is no excuse not to clean up after any dog. Dog fouling can be dangerous to human health, especially to children, the elderly and those with underlying health conditions. When people come in to contact with dog poo, it can cause toxocariasis. This is a parasitic infection with no known cure. It can lead to health issues ranging from dizziness and nausea to seizures and blindness in rare cases.

How to report dog fouling


If you see someone not cleaning up after their dog, you can report this to Hull City Council via the Hull City Council website.

Penalties

If you allow your dog to foul and fail to clean it up immediately, this may result in -

£50 fixed penalty

prosecution and a maximum penalty of £1,000



Neighbourhood Policing Team

A neighbourhood policing team (NPT) is a dedicated group of police officers and Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) focused on a specific community to address local issues. Their role involves direct community engagement, crime prevention, and working with local partners to build trust and solve long-term problems. Unlike officers who respond to emergencies, NPTs are responsible for understanding local needs and developing solutions, acting as a visible and accessible presence for residents.

Collex trolley app

The Collex trolley app is an app for reporting abandoned shopping trolleys, allowing the public to help retailers with collection and recovery. You can download the app from the Google Play or Apple App Store to report abandoned trolley, once reported, Collex will collect the trolley.

How to use the app

Download: Search for "Collex" in your phone's app store and download it.

Report: Use the app to report the location of an abandoned trolley.

Action: Collex will then collect the trolley and return it to the relevant supermarket.
