

Greenwich Avenue Local Centre is set to have facelift

The Greenwich Avenue shops are an important community high street serving local people for over 60 years. Hull City Council is now providing funding to give the local centre a facelift, with work due to start on site later this year.



Your council is currently asking for tenders for works from suitable contractors. The proposed works that we want to deliver include:

- general improved public realm
- retained car parking – including traffic flow plates (measures to control the direction of traffic flow)
- improved landscape setting with SUDS (sustainable drainage)
- surface and landscape improvements
- public realm space for retail and cafes to spill into community space
- new children's play area with natural play equipment
- installation of secure bike racks
- improve or renew awnings above shopping areas
- improved retail shop frontages
- traffic calming measures
- safe pedestrian crossings on north side of Greenwich Avenue
- improve pedestrian and cycle connectivity.

These works are part of the Community Highstreets Programme which is a citywide scheme targeting local and neighbourhood centres across Hull. Work at Greenwich Avenue is due to start soon, during the first phase of these improvement works, with the second phase covering Barham Neighbourhood Centre.

It's been a busy time for the Ward with lots of work being carried out and even more plans to deliver improvements, much more than can be fitted in the newsletter, examples include:-

Brent Avenue Pocket Park

A big thank you to our residents, Daniel and Julia that supported the Neighbourhood Coordinator to consult with the residents and shoppers on Shannon Road, Longhill.

Tedworth Road Turning Circle



Tedworth Road turning circle has been revamped, with a boundary of grasscrete and trees, to create a greener space. The overgrown area of shrubs and bushes was also cleared to make the area tidier and with a fresh new look. The funding for the works were supported by allocating funds from the ward budget and additional funding from the council's Leaders Fund and completed in September 2025.

AKP Fencing

New fencing has been installed in Alderman Kneeshaw Park making the area safer for residents and users of the park. The works were funded by the ward budget and Crime Prevention Fund. As part of the planned reclamation of the green space, the ward Councillors agree to fund the removal of the concrete posts that surrounded the area, to support the development and there will be more in the next newsletter.



Ward Priorities

Current priorities for the area are:-

1. Identify and investigate potential for off-road parking schemes
2. To improve community safety (including nuisance motor bikes)
3. To improve cleanliness of local environment including open and green space

Your local Ward Councillors and Neighbourhood Coordinator are currently working towards addressing these priorities. To find out more, pop into a surgery, forum, Think Tank or Drop-in.

Ward budget allocation 2025/26: Each ward is allocated a capital and revenue sum to support projects that benefit local communities. This fund targets initiative and projects that address the ward priorities. If you are part of a Community Group and would like to apply for funding, ward budget criteria and application forms are available to download from the Neighbourhood Team's webpage www.hull.gov.uk/neighbourhoodteam. Applications that respond to Ward priorities are particularly welcome.
