Mould treatment in your home

what you need to know



Why mould treatment is needed in your home

Mould can grow where there is damp or excess moisture. It can affect your health and damage your home. We carry out treatments to remove mould and help and prevent it returning.

Before the treatment

Our contractor will let you know if there is anything you need to do before the work starts. Please let them know if you have any concerns. If you need any help moving items/furniture please let our contractor know. You will be asked to sign a disclaimer for this.

During the treatment

Our contractor uses protective equipment and will make sure there is good ventilation. They will apply a cleaning solution. This is usually completed in one appointment.

After the treatment

You may notice a slight smell or damp surfaces whilst the treatment is drying.

Keep the treated rooms ventilated.

Important safety advice

We use approved products, but they are classed as hazardous.

Please keep children and pets away from the affected areas during the treatment and after the treatment until it has dried.

Avoid contact with treated areas, wash hands after contact, and seek medical advice if you feel unwell.
